



National Council of Corvette Clubs Roadrunner Region Competition Director

February 27, 2018

Roadrunner Governors and Officers,

I want to share a few reminders as we start a new year:

1. Competition Database Links for 2018:

2. Try to enter your sanctions in the Competition Database as early as possible. Even if you do not have all info available, this will put your events on the region calendar and give the entire membership an opportunity to make advance plans. We can always update flyers and event info later on, but the date(s) will have been announced.
3. Remember that the minimum time for entering sanctions and flyers is 45 days in advance of the event.
4. Sanctioned event results must be entered in the Competition Database within 15 days of your event.
5. Copies (electronic preferred) of all signed waivers for sanctioned events must be sent to the RCD within 15 days of your event.
6. The region event fees must be sent to the region treasurer, Debbie Marple, within 15 days of each event.
 - a. \$2 for every Corvette (NCCC and non-NCCC) entered. Remember that if more than one driver uses a Corvette in a racing event, it is \$2/driver.

The NCCC Competition Committee met Friday evening, February 23rd. We continue work on the 2019-2020 rulebook. Some of the significant items addressed so far are:

1. C7 Grand Sports will compete in Group "M" in high speed events instead of "N." This will be in the next rulebook, but became effective January 1, 2018.
2. An Annual Autocross Technical Inspection program is being drafted. Use will be optional to event hosting clubs.
3. The words "race" and "racing" will be removed from the rulebook.
4. High Speed Certificates will no longer be hard cards. The expiration date will show on the online Membership Card. Note, new plastic Membership cards coming in the future will not have the High speed Certification Expiration Date.
5. Proposed rulebook change to allow a carburetor on a 1982 and still run in stock (Groups 1 or 1S) was rejected.
