Try to enter your sanctions in the Competition Database as early as possible. Even if you do not have all info available, this will put your events on the region calendar and give the entire membership an opportunity to make advance plans. We can always update flyers and event info later on, but the date(s) will have been announced.

Remember that the **minimum time for entering sanctions and flyers is 45 days in advance of the event.**

Sanctioned event **results** must be entered in the Competition Database **within 15 days of your event.**

Copies (electronic preferred) of all signed **waivers** for sanctioned events **must be sent to the RCD within 15 days of your event**. Both adult & minor waivers must be printed two-sided in color. Make sure they have date, location, event type, etc. filled out at the top. Make sure they are witnessed properly at the bottom. Filling these out ahead of time will avoid people signing in the witness area. The **region event fees** must be sent to the **region treasurer**, Debbie Marple, **within 15 days of each event**:

\$2 for every Corvette (NCCC and non-NCCC) entered. Remember that if more than one driver uses a Corvette in a racing event, it is \$2/driver.

The **NCCC Competition Rulebook** is not changed for the 2019 year. **The Redline Version** posted on the NCCC Website will not go into effect until 2020. This manual and other related forms are available on the NCCC Website under **COMPETITION** or by clicking on the link below:

A copy of the **NCCC Rulebook** must be on hand at every event – hard copy or electronic

Event Chairs should read and study NCCC Rulebook Chapter 1 and the chapter for the applicable event type before planning their events.

Event Chairs should check current Rulebook Clarifications for impact on Tech Inspections at competitive driving events

Rallye Rules:

1.) Avoid:

- a) Having clues on freeways where it would be unsafe due to the speed and traffic
- b.) Any busy street that makes cars slow down or turn around searching for clues

2.) Inspect the course for visibility of clues while driving a Corvette since the visibility may be different when driving another type of vehicle.

3.) Check the course in the morning before the rallye in case any changes have occurred on the course that might need to be rectified.

4.) Rallye clues must be **visible and easily seen from the seated driving position without exiting** the car.

5.) Rallye clues on the left should be avoided, but if used, must be so noted in the directions.

6.) All clues/answers must be able to be seen while driving no more than 10% below posted speed limits during daylight.

Insurance Information:

Accidents must be reported to the NCCC Insurance Contact, VP Comp, and RCD within 24 hours. Clubs should not discuss anything about an accident with anyone unless advised to do so by the Insurance Carrier Representative. The Event Chairperson and/or Governor should have copies of **Accident Report forms** on hand at every event including both Personal Injury and Property Damage.
